

Families traveling in private vehicles can choose their own route and time of departure but all are asked to arrive at the Chankú Wasté Ranch on Saturday afternoon, July 1st,

by 4:00 p.m.

Return travel night will be spent as guest of a Baptist

Church to be determined.

Saturday, July 8.

Cost:

The church will pay for the majority of camp cost but each person is asked to contribute for camp food and

other supplies:

\$65 for individuals not traveling with their family

\$130 group price for an entire family.

Requirements for Participation . . .


1st Step: Tell Steve Akin, Juan Moreno or Spencer Hill that you are

Ministry Description . . .

It is said that next to Haiti, the Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota is the most destitute region in our part of the world.

Alcoholism and drug abuse affect many of the young men and women on the Reservation. Mystic and cult religions have intertwined with Christianity to create a confused and misleading message of salvation. Unemployment on the Rez is 80% and the high school drop-out rate is near 80% as well. Teen suicide is 150% greater than in the rest of the country! It is a place where hope is scarce and



despair is the normal way of life. FBCA has been building relationships and helping in various ways on the Rez since 2015. God has opened an exciting door through which we can minister to the Lakota Sioux. Pastor Matt Hadden has established the Chankú Wasté Ranch, which translated means, "The Good Road in the Badlands." Each summer Matt and his staff sponsor 10 weeks of Christian Camp for boys, girls, and teens. FBCA has been invited to lead one of these weeks.

Our Ministry will include:

- Leading an incredible Children's Camp filled with games, crafts and exciting Bible teaching,
- Help with construction projects on private Rez homes,

Sightseeing opportunities include:

Mount Rushmore, Badlands National Park, Wind Cave National Park, Custer State Park, Minuteman Missile Historic Site and much more.
